**[PROPOSED] ORDER OF FINAL
APPROVAL OF SETTLEMENT AND
CERTIFICATION OF CLASS FOR
PURPOSES OF SETTLEMENT**

1 Plaintiffs David and Jauna Cole, on behalf of the Settlement Class¹ and Defendant Wells
2 Fargo Bank, N.A., (“Defendant”) having executed a Settlement Agreement dated January 5, 2010, the
3 Court having entered an Order Preliminarily Approving Settlement and Form of Notice and Initially
4 Certifying Class for Purposes of Settlement on October 27, 2010, the Court having considered the
5 pleadings and all submissions in connection with the proposed settlement, the parties having
6 stipulated to entry of this Order of Final Approval of Settlement and Certification of Class for
7 Purposes of Settlement, and the Court having concluded that it has jurisdiction to adjudicate the
8 issues raised and to provide relief;

9 It is hereby ordered, adjudged and decreed that judgment be entered as follows:

10 **JURISDICTION**

11 1. This Court has jurisdiction over the subject matter and all parties to this action,
12 including the Settlement Class.

13 **PLAINTIFFS AND SETTLEMENT CLASS**

14 2. On October 27, 2010, this Court ordered the certification for settlement purposes of
15 the Settlement Class. The Court also directed Defendant to mail notice of the proposed settlement to
16 class members, pursuant to the terms of the Settlement Agreement.

17 3. The Court finds that notice was given to the Settlement Class that was adequate to
18 apprise Settlement Class members of the terms of the proposed compromise and of the options open
19 to dissenting class members, that the Class Notice had a reasonable chance of reaching a substantial
20 percentage of the class members, that the notice satisfied the requirements of due process under the
21 United States and California Constitutions, that it satisfied applicable California statutes and court
22 rules and all other applicable provisions of law, and that it therefore constituted valid and sufficient
23 notice to the Settlement Class.

24 4. A full opportunity was afforded to the Settlement Class members to participate in,
25 comment on, request exclusion from the settlement and Settlement Class and/or object to the

26 ¹ Where defined by the Settlement Agreement (attached as Exhibit C to Plaintiffs’ Motion for
27 Preliminary Approval of Settlement and Provisional Certification of Class for Purposes of
28 Settlement), the terms set out in this Order of Final Approval of Settlement and Certification of Class
for Purposes of Settlement will have the same meaning as in the Settlement Agreement.

1 Settlement, notice and claims procedure. A list of those members of the Settlement Class who have
2 timely elected to request exclusion from the settlement and the Settlement Class and who therefore
3 are not bound by the settlement, the provisions of the Settlement Agreement, this Order of Final
4 Approval of Settlement and Certification of Class for Purposes of Settlement, or the ensuing
5 Judgment, has been submitted to the Court and is attached to this Order of Final Approval of
6 Settlement and Certification of Class for Purposes of Settlement as Exhibit A.

7 5. The Court has held a hearing to consider the fairness, reasonableness and adequacy of
8 the settlement, has been advised of all objections to the settlement, and has given fair consideration to
9 any such objections.

10 6. For the purpose of considering this settlement and for that purpose only, the Court
11 finds that the named plaintiffs are adequate representatives of the Settlement Class, and that treatment
12 of this action as a class action, on behalf of the Settlement Class, is appropriate and proper.

13 7. The findings and rulings in this Order of Final Approval of Settlement and
14 Certification of Class for Purposes of Settlement are made for the purposes of settlement only, and
15 may not be cited or otherwise used to support the certification of any contested class or subclass in
16 this action or any other action.

17 8. Entry of this Order of Final Approval of Settlement and Certification of Class for
18 Purposes of Settlement is without prejudice to the rights of Defendant to (a) oppose certification in
19 this action, and seek decertification or modification of the Settlement Class as certified, should the
20 Settlement Agreement not be approved or implemented for any reason; or (b) terminate the
21 Settlement Agreement as provided in the Settlement Agreement.

22 **APPROVAL OF THE SETTLEMENT**

23 9. The Court hereby approves the terms of the Settlement Agreement as fair, reasonable,
24 adequate and in the best interests of the Settlement Class.

25 10. Any and all objections to the fairness, reasonableness and/or adequacy of the
26 Settlement Agreement have been considered by the Court and found and determined to be without
27 merit and are overruled in all respects.

1 be forever binding on, and shall have *res judicata* and preclusive effect in, all pending and future
2 lawsuits or other proceedings that are subject to the release and other prohibitions that are set forth in
3 paragraphs 15 through 17 of this Order of Final Approval of Settlement and Certification of Class for
4 Purposes of Settlement that are maintained by, or on behalf of, the Releasing Parties or any other
5 Person subject to the provisions of this Order of Final Approval of Settlement and Certification of
6 Class for Purposes of Settlement.

7 13. In the event that the Effective Date cannot occur, and the Settlement Agreement is
8 canceled or terminated in accordance with the terms and provisions of the Settlement Agreement,
9 then this Order of Final Approval of Settlement and Certification of Class for Purposes of Settlement
10 and the Judgment entered on the Order of Final Approval of Settlement and Certification of Class for
11 Purposes of Settlement shall be rendered null and void and be vacated and all orders by this Court in
12 connection with this settlement shall be rendered null and void.

13 14. The provisions of this Order of Final Approval of Settlement and Certification of
14 Class for Purposes of Settlement are applicable to and binding upon Defendant and upon Plaintiffs,
15 all other members of the Settlement Class, and all of their heirs, administrators, executors, successors,
16 and assigns.

17 15. All Releasing Parties are permanently enjoined from (i) filing, commencing,
18 prosecuting, continuing, maintaining, intervening in, participating in (as class members or otherwise)
19 or receiving any benefits from any lawsuit, arbitration, administrative or regulatory proceeding or
20 order in any jurisdiction based on any or all Released Claims against one or more Released Parties or
21 against any person or entity who may claim over against any Released Party for contribution or
22 indemnity; (ii) instituting, continuing, maintaining, organizing class members in, or joining with class
23 members in, any action or arbitration, including but not limited to a purported class action, in any
24 jurisdiction, against one or more Released Parties, or against any person or entity who may claim
25 over against any Released Party for contribution or indemnity, based on, involving, or incorporating,
26 directly or indirectly, any or all Released Claims; and (iii) filing, commencing, prosecuting,
27 intervening in, participating in (as class members or otherwise) or receiving any benefits from any
28 lawsuit, arbitration, administrative or regulatory proceeding, or order in any jurisdiction based on an

1 allegation that an action taken by the Released Parties, which is in compliance with the provisions of
2 the Settlement Agreement, violates any legal right of any Settlement Class member.

3 16. In addition to the above, the Releasing Parties and each of them are deemed to have
4 agreed and covenanted not to sue or prosecute, institute or cooperate in the institution,
5 commencement, filing or prosecution of any suit or proceeding in any forum against any Released
6 Party, or against any other person or entity who may claim contribution or indemnity from or against
7 any Released Party, based upon any Released Claim.

8 17. With respect to all Released Claims, the Releasing Parties and each of them agree that
9 they are expressly waiving and relinquishing, to the fullest extent permitted by federal law, state law,
10 foreign law or principles of common law, any rights that may have the effect of limiting the releases
11 set forth in the Settlement Agreement. This agreement shall include a waiver of any rights pursuant
12 to Section 1542 of the California Civil Code and any similar, comparable or equivalent provision.

13 California Civil Code Section 1542 provides:

14 A GENERAL RELEASE DOES NOT EXTEND TO CLAIMS WHICH THE
15 CREDITOR DOES NOT KNOW OR SUSPECT TO EXIST IN HIS OR HER
16 FAVOR AT THE TIME OF EXECUTING THE RELEASE, WHICH IF
17 KNOWN BY HIM OR HER MUST HAVE MATERIALLY AFFECTED
18 HIS OR HER SETTLEMENT WITH THE DEBTOR.

19 Notwithstanding Section 1542 of the California Civil Code, or any other statute or rule of law
20 of similar effect, the Settlement Agreement shall be given full force and effect according to each and
21 all of its expressed terms and provisions, including those related to any unknown or unsuspected
22 claims, liabilities, demands or causes of action which are based on, arise from or are in any way
23 connected with the Action. All Parties to the Settlement Agreement are held to have been advised
24 specifically by their legal counsel of the effect of this waiver, and hereby expressly acknowledge that
25 they understand the significance and consequence of the expressed waiver of California Civil Code
26 Section 1542.

27 CLASS RELIEF

28 18. In consideration for the release from the Settlement Class, and in full and final
settlement of all Released Claims by the Settlement Class against the Released Parties:

1 A. Defendant will provide a check for \$15, \$10, or \$5, as appropriate, to each member of the
2 Settlement Class who submitted a Qualifying Claim. Any checks not cashed by members
3 of the Settlement Class within 60 days, and any otherwise unclaimed monies, shall
4 become the property of the Defendant.

5 B. Defendant will pay an incentive payment to each of the named Plaintiffs, David Cole and
6 Jauna Cole, in the amount of \$1,500 each.

7 APPLICATION FOR ATTORNEYS' FEES

8 19. Having read, heard, and considered the pleadings, declarations, exhibits submitted in
9 connection with Class Counsel's Application for Award of Attorneys' Fees and Reimbursement of
10 Expenses, and finding that the requested attorneys' fees and reimbursement of expenses are
11 reasonable and supported, Class Counsel are awarded ~~\$28,627~~ in attorneys' fees and reimbursement
12 of expenses in the amount of \$17,373, to be allocated in the discretion of Class Counsel. Class PPB
13 Counsel agree that, in the event that this Order of Final Approval of Settlement and Certification of
14 Class for Purposes of Settlement is reversed on appeal, or the Settlement Agreement is terminated in
15 accordance with the provisions of the Settlement Agreement, these funds shall become the property
16 of National Union Fire Insurance Company of Pittsburgh, Pa., and Class Counsel shall repay the
17 funds to that entity.

18 20. The effectiveness of this Order of Final Approval of Settlement and Certification of
19 Class for Purposes of Settlement, the Judgment entered on the Order of Final Approval of Settlement
20 and Certification of Class for Purposes of Settlement, and the obligations of Plaintiffs and Defendant
21 under the settlement shall not be conditioned upon or subject to the resolution of any appeal from this
22 Order of Final Approval of Settlement and Certification of Class for Purposes of Settlement, or the
23 Judgment entered on the Order of Final Approval of Settlement and Certification of Class for
24 Purposes of Settlement, that relates solely to the issue of Class Counsel's application for an award of
25 attorneys' fees and reimbursement of expenses.

26 ENTRY OF JUDGMENT; CONTINUING JURISDICTION


27 21. The Parties to the Settlement Agreement are hereby authorized and directed to comply
28 with and to consummate the Settlement Agreement in accordance with its terms and provisions, and

1 the Court Clerk is directed to enter and docket the Judgment in the form attached to this Order of
2 Final Approval of Settlement and Certification of Class for Purposes of Settlement dismissing this
3 Action (and any and all claims asserted in the Action at any time) in its entirety, as to Defendant, with
4 prejudice and without leave to amend, where such dismissal shall constitute a final judgment on the
5 merits to which the principles of res judicata shall apply to the fullest extent of the law as to the
6 Released Parties identified in the Settlement Agreement, with each party to bear his/her/its own costs
7 and attorneys' fees (except as otherwise expressly provided in this Order of Final Approval of
8 Settlement and Certification of Class for Purposes of Settlement).

9 22. Without affecting the finality of this Judgment, this Court shall retain exclusive and
10 continuing jurisdiction over this action and the Parties, including all Settlement Class members, for
11 purposes of supervising, administering, implementing, enforcing, and interpreting the settlement and
12 claims process; the application for attorneys' fees, expenses and costs related to the Settlement
13 Agreement; all proceedings related to the Settlement Agreement both before and after the Order of
14 Final Approval of Settlement and Certification of Class for Purposes of Settlement becomes final and
15 is no longer subject to appeal, and over enforcement of the Order of Final Approval of Settlement and
16 Certification of Class for Purposes of Settlement, including but not limited to the order described in
17 Paragraph 15.

19 **IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED.**
